Council Member Nix brought up the discussed Code Enforcement and Business Licenses being tied in together. There are several contractors that work on the weekends and we need to know if they have purchased a business license. Mayor Cost stated this was discussed in the Department Head meeting and how the different divisions should be supporting each other. Chief Littleton stated that if Debby Raymond needed assistance they would be glad to help. They are shorthanded on patrol and David Holloway, the new Code Enforcement Officer, is pulling double duty as Code Enforcer and patrol. But, he is only scheduled for half a week right now until we can get additional officers higher and then we can put him back on full time.

Mayor Cost called on the Sustainability Committee – Council Member Hughes requested information from Kirk Hamby about the potholes in the area. Mr. Hamdy reported that they have been working on repairing the potholes and will continue to work on them. The question was then raised about the removal of all scrap bicycles. Bicycles were removed about three or four weeks ago and taken to recycle and any money gained went to ValloCycle. Approximately \$115.00 was turned in for the bicycles.

Mayor Cost requested that Kirk Hamby go ahead and provide us with his report and to please talk about our significant loss this week. He thanked all of the Emergency Personnel that came and assisted with James "Sleepy" Scott. He mentioned that everything was very professional and if he would have made it until July, 2014 he would have been with the City of Montevallo for 26 years. He was a Vietnam Vet. He also discussed what kind of person Sleepy was and how hard it is going to be to replace him. Kirk Hamby then brought up the roof on the Recycling Center. They were going to try and start on the roof Wednesday weather permitting. It has also been requested that the glass dumpster be a shorter dumpster and that a request had been made for a shorter dumpster to be delivered and it will be easier to monitor.

Council Member Nix opening reported opening day for baseball season was March 15, 2014 and that the dedication of both fields and concession stand took place at the Opening Ceremonies, dedicating one field to Mr. Higgins and the other to Mr. Dubose, both were players of the Black Barons.

Ed Davis presented the Montevallo Golf Course report:

Report as of February 23, 2014

The best thing to report is that rounds are up substantially from last year despite continual bad weather. We are keeping payroll down and with income up, we are very optimistic about the year.

Our goal is to increase revenues over last year while decreasing expenses over last year to create a more profitable situation for Montevallo Golf Club. So far through the first 4.5 months, revenues from Cart/G.fees, Cart House rentals, Driving Range, Initiation fees, beer sales, and Membership fees have increased \$6625 while expenses have decreased by \$10878.00 for a net gain of \$17503.69 over last year. A great start to the year, especially due to the bad weather we have had.

Ed Davis-PGA Golf Department The following is an analysis on Cart and Green fee income for October 1 thru January 14th, 2014 compared to October 1 thru January 14th 2013, the first three months of the new fiscal year. Also included are payroll expenses for the same timespan this year as compared to the same period last year. We are running promotions to increase income from Cart/G. fees and are cutting payroll wherever we can.

- 1. Our total rounds for October January 14th were 2948 rounds compared to 3054 rounds in Oct-Jan. 2013, a slight decrease in rounds of 106 rounds (Dec. was down 108 rounds as the weather was brutal).
- 2. Revenue for this October-January 14th 2014 has decreased \$2398 from Cart /G.fees from last year to this year.

Council Member Woodham stated that she has been working with the Regional Planning Commission to get some of the trail maps updated and the handouts updated.

Council Member Nix reported the Historical Commission determined at their last meeting that they were going to go ahead and start pushing through the downtown historical district for the urban core area. This is something that needs to be done to help protect the buildings before we start the revitalization plan. A Designer Review Board will be created and they will have standards that property owners within the District will have to go by. The main concern will be the outside facade and not what is inside the buildings. Dr. Lott believes that it will take about a month or two.

Council Member Nix said there was nothing to discuss for Planning & Zoning but said the Annexation Committee has formed and that he will get everybody together to discuss setting goals and objectives within a few weeks.

Council Member Gilbert discussed the renovations of the schools. A lot of progress has been made in the front the High School and Elementary School. There is no update on the Middle School property at this time. The last time she spoke with Dr. Brooks they were still trying to negotiate with the property owner for an easement so they could work on the gymnasium.

Mayor Cost called on Council Member Don Hughes to introduce the Montevallo High School Bass Team. Council Member Hughes introduced their representative, Mr. Jim Hicks, who is also an employee with Airport Marine. Council Member Hughes explained how this Bass Team came about and how they had to qualify to be on the team.

Opportunities for citizens to speak to the Council

Mrs. Julie Smitherman addressed the Council regarding Hotel Feasibility study and how it has not made it to the website. It was explained that it is a large group of documents and it may need to be split up

into sections. Mayor Cost offered her to come down to City Hall any time to review the hard copy. Council Member Woodham also stated that we will be sending representatives to a conference in Atlanta that is coming up at the end of this month. It is for Mid-Market Hotels we will be sending the RFP out after that conference, so we would expect replies from that in a month or two.

Mr. Thomas Lilly Jr. addressed the Council about the Dailey Park Project and when it's scheduled to start. Herman Lehman explained that we retained the developers, approved the builders and they said it would take about 60 to 90 days for everything to be put together. They are expecting it to be completed by the end of summer. We do not have anyone to do the demolition of the homes but we are expecting bids to come in. Council Member Hughes stated that there were certain restrictions that would have to be met before they start demolition. They will have to put up a bond, insurance, and business license. Mr. Lilly then stated that his goal is to see the City of Montevallo prosper.

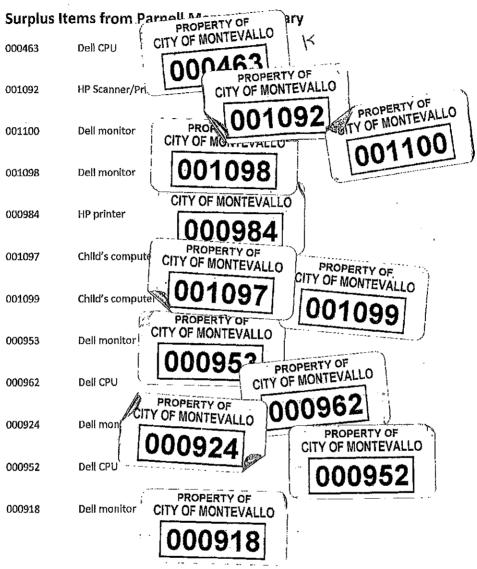
Moved back in to Committee Reports and Consideration of Bills

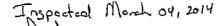

Mayor Cost presented the Proclamation for Parental Alienation Day/Week. Proclamation was read by Herman Lehman. Mayor Cost stated that the Proclamation was approved last year.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS: Strong family relationships constitute the foundation of our community; and

WHEREAS: Alienating behaviors are frequently present in high-conflict divorces, separations, and asymmetrical custody arrangements; and

WHEREAS: Behaviors such as speaking negatively about a parent to, or in front of, a child and interfering with parenting time and communication can not only destroy the bond between a loving parent and child, but can cause a child mental and emotional harm, as such alienating tactics are confusing, frightening, and rob children of their sense of security; and

WHEREAS: Parental alienation takes advantage of the innocent and impressionable, depriving children of their right to freely love and be loved by both parents and extended family; and

WHEREAS: Mental professionals agree that the negative effects of parental alienation can follow a child into adulthood with tragic consequences; and

WHEREAS: The recently published Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders (DSM-5) made several references to the dysfunctional family dynamic of alienation to be a form of psychological child abuse; and

WHEREAS: Approximately 40,000 children in the State of Alabama subjected to child custody determination in 2012; and

WHEREAS: Parental Alienation Prevention Week is intended to increase the knowledge and understanding of this problem to help Alabamians, institutions, the legal and mental health community, leaders to better identify and combat such abusive behavior to children; and

WHEREAS: God so loved us, we also ought to love one another; love does no harm to its neighbor; therefore love is the fulfillment of the law; and

WHEREAS: The organizers of Parental Alienation Prevention Week are asking everyone to blow soap bubbles at noon on April 25th to show their support in spreading the simple message that children should be allowed to freely love both of their parents and extended family members; each free flowing bubble representing the love a child should have for his or her mother and father.

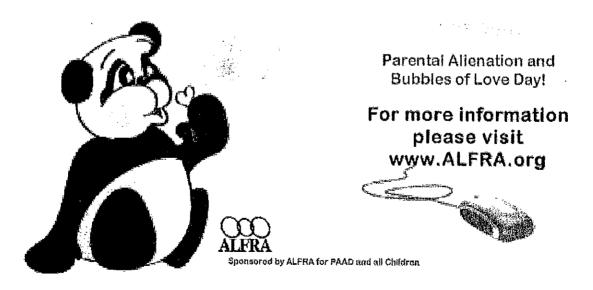

Council Member Goldsmith made a Motion to approve the proclamation. Council Member Woodham seconded. ALL COUNCIL MEMBERS VOTED AYE — MOTION APPROVED.

Chief Littleton asked to transfer unclaimed bicycles to ValloCycle. He said they had a published notice about claiming these bicycles and no one came forward. They have had them over a year and ValloCycle wants them as surplus

Council Member Nix made a Motion to Transfer the bicycles to ValloCycle. Council Member Gilbert seconded. ALL COUNCIL MEMBERS VOTED AYE – MOTION APPROVED.

Mayor Cost discussed the recommendation to MDCD that we use \$240,000.00 to be used to install new lighting at Orr Park Ball Fields, it has been identified that the lighting in Orr Park is a safety hazard. This was recommended to us by the Shelby County Electrical Engineers. Council Member Woodham stated that this came about when all the work was being done for the University of Montevallo softball field. This was put out to bid at the same time as the University of Montevallo's bid was done. Even though \$240,000.00 sounds expensive but in will be cheaper to do it now while they are doing all the work for the University of Montevallo's softball field. The Finance Committee recommends that we go ahead and do this. We have additional monies in the paving budget. Council Member Hughes stated that there are no funds from the Shelby County Board of Education and that the athletics is separated from the school system. He also claimed that it was up to the booster clubs, parents, coaches to raise that kind of money and this has now been turned over to us a City level. Council Member Nix does not agree to take funds from something that has already been allocated even though there is enough for Phase 1 and Phase 2. You always have to say "What if" — what if is going to cost a little more? What if something comes up and we have to do a little bit of more paving? What about that road that we have to eventually put in between the housing authority and Hwy 119.

Mayor Cost said that we have everything prioritized, and that they met with the High School Principal, Coach, Athletic Director that they will need to start taking on the lighting expenses. They will not be able to do it now because it has not been budgeted but will be included.

They are going to try and do additional fund raisers and there is just no money there to assist at this time. The discussion of keys and kilowatt hours was brought up and how the switch boxes will need to have keys to prevent the lights being turned on.

Council Member Hughes made a motion to approve the lighting (deferred funds from paving). Council Member Woodham seconded. Council Member Nix opposed. ALL OTHERS VOTED AYE... MOTION APPROVED.

Mayor Cost discussed the position of Park Director. This position will be working very closely with Mr. Hamdy. This position will not create a hardship and can pay for itself within a couple of years through tournaments. These numbers have been confirmed through Shelby County and other Park Director positions as well. The Park Director position would pay \$40,000.00 a year. We would have to make an amendment to the budge in order to create this

City of Montevallo Job Description Administration

Effective Date: March 10, 2014

Job Summary: The Park & Recreation Director works under the supervision of the Public Works Director. The nature of the work performed requires that there be an effective working relationship with other departments, the Park & Recreation Board(s), city employees, representatives of business and community organizations, and the general public. The Park & Recreation Director oversees the development, management, and operation of parks and recreational facilities, recreation and youth services, and tournaments. Work includes organizing, planning, coordinating, evaluating, and directing the work of staff and other support employees. The Director is also charged with maximizing the use and financial return of all of the city's parks and recreational centers, including expanding tournaments and other events at our city facilities.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS OF THE IOB:

- · Plans, formulates, and implements short- and long-term goals for park and recreational activities.
- Plans, organizes, coordinates, and assigns the work of subordinate staff; conducts performance evaluations; hire, trains, supervises subordinate staff.
- · Establishes and implements operating policies and procedures.
- · Reviews reports, budgets, goals, and policies proposed by staff.
- · Prepares, reviews, analyzes, and presents operating budgets; prepares capital improvement budget.
- · Oversees and directs review and evaluation of the division's overall operating effectiveness.
- Meets with community and business groups to establish community partnerships; serves as liaison with the Parks and Recreation Boards, Trail Committee, etc.
- Develops grant applications and requests for proposals; prepares and reviews service contracts; administers and monitors the use of grant funds.
- Supervises construction, repair, and maintenance of recreation/park areas, equipment, and facilities.
- · Coordinates park/facility maintenance with staff.
- · Plans, organizes, and supervises facility design.
- · Initiates maintenance and repair work orders for facilities and park areas.
- Promotes and ensures proper employee training and compliance with city safety program and departmental safety procedures; ensures that all equipment, materials, and work conditions are adequately maintained to prevent accidents.
- Practices continuous learning through individual study, classroom training, seminars, and conferences.

- Performs work safely in accordance with department safety procedures and the City Safety Program.
 Operates equipment safely and reports any unsafe work condition or practice to Director of Public Works
- May be required to report to work to serve customers during emergency conditions. May be assigned
 to report at a different time and location and to perform different duties as necessary.
- Performs related work as required.

Bachelor's Degree in parks, recreational, and leisure services or related field; a master's degree in parks and recreation is a plus; and six years of experience in public recreation, including two years in planning and administration; or any equivalent combination of acceptable education and experience providing the knowledge, abilities, and skills cited above.

NECESSARY SPECIAL QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must possess and maintain a valid Alabama driver's license and have an acceptable driving record based upon City criteria.
- Requires background check and post-offer drug test.

The Council discussed Orr Park replanting and the erosion that has been going on there. We need to look at taking down some trees and planting new trees. We are looking to get our Landscape Architect to look at what it is going to take to do this and look at the financials for this project.

Citizen Participation

Mrs. Julie Smitherman asked when the final day for Main Street comments. Citizens have until the 14th to turn in any comments regarding the Main Street project. Everything that has been submitted in writing has to be addressed. ALDOT will provide us with all the information we will respond to Council Member Hughes wanted everyone remember that there are certain guidelines that have to be followed. They have had a lot of positive feedback on this project but there are certain restrictions and guidelines. Mrs. Julie Smitherman asked if the form was on the website – Herman Lehman said that he would forward it to Sandy to make sure that it is posted.

Mr. Lilly discussed the basketball goals and asked if we have come up with a solution to take them down.

Ed Davis claims that they lose a lot of range balls and would like to use the extra poles to use on driving range. Council Member Hughes wants to use them on the extra field that is not lighted at this time.

Mrs. Welcome addressed the council about County Road 203. It was determined that the City is responsible for 203 and we just need to figure out the funds to pay for it to be paved. The original price was \$42,000.00 to pave all of County Road 203 but was rejected by Council Member Don Hughes — the part that Mrs. Welcome is concerned with is from where you enter to Western Drive. Mayor Cost requested that this be brought up and put on the Agenda for the next council meeting.

There being no further business, Council Member Nix made a motion to adjourn. Council Member Gilbert seconded. ALL VOTED AYES ... MOTION APPROVED.
