MINUTES

Montevallo City Council Work Session March 8, 2021 5:30 p.m. at City Hall

Mayor Rusty Nix, Council Member David King, Council Member Lelia Mitchell, Council Member Kenneth Dukes, Council Member Sonya Swords, Council Member Martha Eisenberg, were in attendance. Quorum present.

Mayor Rusty Nix opened the work session at 5:30 p.m.

Chief Littleton presented the Police Department Monthly Report with a total of 605 cases. See Appendix 1.

Chief Davis presented the Fire Department Monthly Report with 23 EMS Calls, Four Fires and One Vehicle Fire. See Appendix 2.

Kerri Pate addressed Council and announced her candidacy for the Alabama House of Representatives, District 73 and informed Council of her candidate platform for the March 30th Primary Election.

Councilman David King announced there is a Planning and Zoning meeting in the Chamber on March 18, 2021 and a Work Session at 6 p.m. on March 11, 2021.

Councilman Dukes called on Kirk Hamby, Public Works Director, he reported Brush Trailer is on schedule for first or second week of April 2021. Surplus equipment and vehicles to be placed at auction and some of those items are to be scrapped. He reported the streetlights at Hwy. 25 and Hwy. 119 are still out and that Alabama Power working to remedy. He advised the tree at Nabors and Moody Street has been removed by a contractor and the City cleaned it up and hauled it off. Work has been completed.

Councilman Dukes called on Olivia Barone, Sustainability Coordinator. She announced that Free Dump Day will be held from 7:30 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, March 27th at the Shelby County Landfill. She reported Arbor Day event was a success. ALDOT approved the Permit to convert lights on state routes to LED which will improve aesthetics, safety and cost savings. C&C Electric has all the materials for the lighting upgrade at Parnell Library and will start next week. Savannah has been a great partner during this project. See Appendix 3.

Councilman Dukes gave an update on the Historical Commission and advised they have moved their meetings to quarterly and the next meeting will be on April 13th at 6:30 p.m. They will continue working on the Historical Trail and African American Trail.

Councilwoman Eisenburg called on Shane Baugh, Parks and Recreation Director, he reported that the department is very busy with the travel ball tournaments and the parks have been full. Shoal Creek Park brings visitors from all over the county. Mayor Nix asked Shane if we could have a survey or sign in book to determine where travel ball tournament teams and visitors are from that visit our parks. Youth teams start next week. Soccer starts April 3rd. Malher House project is waiting on architect to approve final phase of work.

Councilwoman Mitchell called on Savannah Kitchens Library Director for the Library Report. She reported 17, 203 items checked out which is an increase from newly reported ebook circulation. She reported there were 866 Wifi & Computer Sessions, 864 Database searches, 360 Visits to the building, 203 program participation and 83 calls for services. See Appendix 4.

Councilwoman Mitchell called on Impact Director Sarah Hogan and she called on Junior Mayor Pro Tem, Ms. Rebeca Emiliano for the Montevallo Junior City Council (MJCC) report. Rebecca reported welcoming a new Middle School member to the council and they continue to interview and take applications for membership. The MJCC is working on a Spring project and partnering with the High School Ag class and Park & Recreation to do a build a Bird House project.

Sarah Hogan reported Impact Montevallo held a Coalition Meeting last week virtually and will be continuing those for the foreseeable future. Members approved the reallocation of unused travel funds to provide funding for our two School Resource Officers to attend the SRO basic and advanced training courses this summer. She thanked the Shelby Emergency Assistance (SEA) Director for arranging an SEA Intern to shadow and learn about IMPACT. See Appendix 5.

Councilman Dukes made a motion to approve the Minutes as presented, Second Councilman King, All Ayes, Councilwoman Mitchell Abstained, Motion Passed.

Recognitions / Awards: Mayor Nix recognized Montevallo High School Athletes for their excellence. Coach Blake Boren was recognized with a game ball from a parent for his outstanding work with the students. Mayor Nix recognized Walt Czeskleba for being in business 49 years on Main Street. See Appendix 6.

Opportunities for citizens to speak to the Council:

Robert Hurt, 176 Moores Spring, asked that Council not use City funds on Sims House project. He stated that in so doing the City would be funding competition for professional licensed counselors in the area.

Joyce Lewis, 330 Reonda Lane, thanked the council for the Tennis (practice) Board that has been installed for the team. Teams play on Monday and practice on Tuesday and Thursday.

Councilman Dukes spoke regarding the COVID vaccine sites in city and where they are available. Montevallo Drugs is going to be a site and CVS. Mayor Nix stated that via the quarterly Mayors meeting, he was informed that Shelby County was only supplied with 2,500 vaccines.

IMPACT Director Sarah Hogan resumed her report. IMPACT Montevallo has finalized their new logo. School Resource Officer Holloway coordinated with Shelby County for a Distracted Driving Crash Scene at Montevallo High School this week.

Councilwoman Mitchell reported March 22 – 26 is Spring Break for schools. This Friday, March 12, there is no school for students it is a teacher's workday. U.S. News & World Report recognized the University of Montevallo as one of the top online Master's Degree Programs in the nation. The Graduate Program and the University of Montevallo College of Education and Human Development was ranked one of the top programs in Alabama and in the top 70 in the nation for its online Master's Degree Program.

She gave an update on the Boys and Girls Club that they are excited to be participating the BGCA's National Fine Arts competitions in 14 different categories. Sign up for summer has started and June 3rd will be the 1st day of summer camp. See Appendix 7.

Councilwoman Mitchell reported the Festival of Tulips at the American Village is scheduled to open this week on Wednesday, March 10th from 10:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. Remember to social distance, wear your mask, and wash your hands.

Councilwoman Swords asked Executive Director, Adele Nelson, Montevallo Chamber of Commerce to give an update. Adele reported the Chamber Chatter was delivered Friday, February 26th. The Soul Spot Montevallo ribbon cutting has been rescheduled to Saturday, March 27th at 10:00 a.m. – 728 Main Street. The 2nd Annual Blooming Bargains, partnership between the Chamber and Main Street, will begin Wednesday, March 10th with the opening of the 5th Annual Festival of Tulips. See Appendix 8.

Main Street Executive Director Courtney Bennett reported that on February 23rd, Design Committee Chair Kirk Lightfoot and I presented a \$500 donation to American Village out of proceeds from the Veteran Banner project. Friday Nights at the Cove series will begin the last Friday in April. She reminded everyone to vote for your favorite Montevallo business in *Shelby Living Magazine's* "Best of the Best" contest. - Recommendation to add Fax Line Service to Parnell Memorial Library from Verizon.
 Estimated \$23 per month, requires one time purchase of Fax Adaptor Device at a cost of \$79.95. Motion made by Councilwoman Eisenberg, second by Councilwoman Mitchell, All Ayes. Motion passed.
- Recommendation to allow Public Works to liquidate the presented list of items as surplus equipment for auction and or disposal as scrap material. Motion made by Councilwoman Eisenburg, second by Councilman Dukes. All Ayes. Motion passes. See Appendix 12.

Board Appointments: Appointment of Justin Lutz to the Design Review Committee Term to expire 03.08.24. Appointment of Brandelyn Nelson to the Design Review Committee Term to expire 03.08.24. Motion made by Councilman King to accept appointees as a slate, second by Councilman Dukes, All Ayes. Motion passed. See Appendix 13.

Other Business: Discussion about \$125,000 in funding provided by MDCD for the Sims House Project was initiated by Councilwoman Eisenberg. She stated that the Council should not support the funding. Motion made by Councilwoman Eisenberg to withdraw funds from Sims House, \$125,000. There was no second.

Councilman Dukes said he was in support of the funding to remain in effect. MDCD does not have to get Council approval. Councilwoman Swords spoke that there need to be more checks and balances with MDCD funds. Councilman King spoke in support of MDCD and would like to see more oversite of MDCD. Mayor Nix and City Clerk Gilbert explained MDCD structure and projects. City Clerk Gilbert was asked by Council to have legal counsel look at the Articles of Incorporation of the MDCD.

Citizen Participation: Robert Hurt, 176 Moores Spring, spoke previously, he stated that there is an adolescent program for counseling in collaboration with the City of Alabaster YMCA that addresses the needs of the community. City funds need to be used for reinvestment in the City.

C.P. Pierson 1131 Oak Street, MDCD funds that have been approved cannot be rescinded by the current Council according to Robert's Rules of Order.

Ms. Sarah Hogan called on Junior Mayor Pro Tem, Ms. Rebecca Emiliano for the Montevallo Junior City Council report.

MJCC: Montevallo Junior City Council

- MJCC has welcomed a new member, we are happy to have a Middle School member join the council and continue to interview and take applications.
- MJCC continues to feature youth on their Facebook and Instagram for Super Youth Saturday, and if anyone knows a youth who should be featured, they can message MJCC on Facebook.
- MJCC is partnering with the high school Ag class and Park & Recreation on a Bird House project, in which youth organizations will build and design artistic bird houses to be placed in local parks.
- MJCC is working on a promotional video to highlight the mission, projects and accomplishments
 of the MJCC.

Sarah provided the following updates from Impact Montevallo:

- Coalition Meeting: We held our monthly virtual meeting last Tuesday, March 2. Members did vote to continue to host meetings virtually for the foreseeable future. Members approved the reallocation of unused travel funds to provide funding for our two School Resource Officers to attend the SRO basic and advanced training courses this summer in conjunction with the 22nd Safe Schools Conference, which I will also attend to gain additional knowledge in social and emotional learning strategies to deter negative behavior choice. Members also worked to identify potential activities and special events we can host for our youth for positive reinforcement for behavior choices.
- **SEA Intern:** I was fortunate to have Monique an Intern with Shelby Emergency Assistance and supervisor with DHR shadow me this morning to learn more about our program and community involvement. Thank you to SEA Director, Amanda Fowler for arranging this collaboration. Amanda is an active member of IMPACT.
- New logo/branding: Impact Montevallo has finalized our new logo and branding with the
 help of Steven Dixon with Dixon Designs. The original logo and tag line were updated to
 include Montevallo and add some additional elements and color. We are proud of the
 community we serve, and we want it to be showcased and represented as we gain more
 state and national recognition.
- Distracted Driving Crash Scene: SRO Holloway has coordinated with Shelby County for a
 Distracted Driving Crash Scene at the High School this week. The scene includes three

wrecked cars outside the cafeteria. Officer Holloway is providing verbiage to tell the story of the collision involving each car and also talking with students during the lunch on the dangers of drinking and driving and texting and driving. We hope to purchase an alcohol impairment kit with goggles for him to use in later follow-up discussions and active learning opportunities.

- Monthly Video: To continue with our Public Awareness campaign regarding the dangers and
 risks associated with Marijuana, this month's video with our SRO's will focus on "The Truth of
 Marijuana." We will be filming over the next few days and the video will be released prior to
 Spring Break. Watch for that on our social media.
- Youth Banner Project: We are making progress on our youth banner project with Montevallo Main Street and hope to have it in the hands of School Admin and Art Teachers within the week to be completed by students by the end of the school year.
- PRIDE Survey: I have talked with Mr. Bromley at the high school regarding the annual PRIDE Survey that is administered by Shelby County Schools. The survey is funded by the Board of Education and is counted towards in-kind contribution to our grant. The survey is administered to 7th, 9th and 11th grade students and provides crucial data on substance use for our specific community.
- Super Youth Saturday: One more plug, to request that you nominate youth for the Super Youth Saturday recognition. The 7 athletes that were recognized during the meeting tonight would be great candidates for this recognition. All you have to do is fill out the link on the Montevallo Junior City Council Facebook page. Recognize the great choices your own kids, friend's or neighbor's kids. Let's take the time to let our youth know we notice their good choices.

Montevallo High School Athletics Montevallo City Council Meeting

Cole Dennis [Wrestling/Football]: Cole recently finished as the Alabama High School Athletic Association State Runner Up at the AHSAA Class 1A-4A Wrestling State Championships. He finished his season 27-3, with his 27 victories by Pin. He is the first wrestler in the history of Montevallo to compete in the State Finals. In Football, Cole finished his junior season as an All-County performer, anchoring both the Offensive and Defensive Lines for the Bulldogs.

Joseph Anderson [Football]: Joseph finished his Junior Season rushing for 1,156 Yards and 16 TD's in only 8 games played due to Covid-19. He was twiced named the AL.Com Hollis Wright Player of the Week for his performances against #1 Ranked ACA and Holt (The only player in Metro Birmingham to do so). Joseph finished the season rushing for over 170 Yards of 5 of 8 Games. For his performance, Joseph was named to the Alabama Sports Writers Association All State Team in Class 4A, along with All County and All Metro.

Kial Cottingham [Football]: Kial finished his Junior Season with 43 Receptions for 621 Yards and 5 TD's. Defensively, Kial finished the season with 6 INT's, which was Tied for 5th most among all classifications in the State of Alabama. For his performance in 2020, Kial was named to the Alabama Sports Writers Association All State Team in Class 4A, along with All County and All Metro.

Hunter Bass [Wrestling]: Hunter completed his Senior Year as the 3rd Place finisher in the 220 lb. Weight Class at the Alabama High School Athletic Association Class 1A-4A Wrestling State Championship. His record this year was 30-1. In Football, Hunter started as an Offensive Lineman for the Bulldogs, helping lead them to the 2nd Round of the State Playoffs in 2020.



Hannah Locks [Volleyball]: Hannah finished the fall as a member of the All County Team. She was named as a Team Captain by her peers. She is also a member of the Cheerleading Team and Soccer Team.
