Work Session called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Mayor Nix. No quorum present during Work Session.

Mayor Nix called on United Way representatives, presentation by Larry Crocker and Jeff Dodson regarding Centurial Park construction in Stephens Park done by United Way at no cost to the City.

#### **Mayor Nix Called for Committee Reports:**

Mayor Nix called on Council Member King for Public Health & Safety: Council Member King called on Chief Littleton for the Police Department report. Chief Littleton reported there were 67 Cases in March and 263 Total Reports year to date. See Appendix 1.

Council Member King called on Chief Davis for the Fire Department Report. Chief Davis reported there were 59 Calls for the first half of March. See Appendix 2.

Council Member King advised Planning and Zoning will meet on April 20<sup>th</sup> at 6 p.m. in Council Chamber and the meeting is open to the public.

Mayor Nix called on Council Member Dukes for the Sustainability Report. Council Member Dukes called on Kirk Hamby, Head of Public Works. Kirk reported Public Works had planted areas of grass in Orr Park getting park ready for Arts Fest and due to the recent heavy rain the grass was washed away. He

reported they had worked on the drainage on Davis Street. Kirk reported Oak Street between Plowman and Wadsworth was closed for sewer repairs until further notice. He reminded everyone Free Dump Day will be held from 7 a.m. – 2 p.m. on April 1<sup>st</sup> at the Recycling Center.

Mayor Nix called for Recreation, Preservation and Community Development Reports. Mayor Nix called on Shane Baugh, Head of Parks and Recreation. Shane reported basketball and softball is underway; soccer participants have grown so much they don't have enough goals to practice on; and Shane reported the restrooms cannot handle the capacity of all the sports programs.

Mayor Nix called for the Education, Arts and Outreach Committee Reports. Mayor Nix called on Savannah Kitchens Director of Parnell Memorial Library. Savannah reported the April calendar of events has been posted; Library Egg Hunts are coming up in April; and the Library will be closed for the Easter Holiday April 7<sup>th</sup> – April 9<sup>th</sup>. Council Member Mitchell called on Sarah Hogan, IMPACT Montevallo. Sarah reported the Alabama House and Senate are asking for feedback on the 2023 Farm Bill – to close the loophole regarding cannabinoid products and the sale to minors. She reported on the upcoming events hosted by Impact: National Walk in the Park Day and the Spring Fling Family Food Truck Fest. No written report was submitted.

Mayor Nix called on Julia Smith, Mayor, Montevallo Junior City Council (MJCC). Julia reported MJCC would be participating in the National Walk in the Park Day event with Impact; the next meeting for MJCC is April 3<sup>rd</sup> at City Hall in Council Chambers.



There will be other recreational amenities such as BBQ grills, picnic tables, benches, and garden elements.




# How You Can Help

## **Fair Housing Month Proclamation**

WHEREAS, April 11, 2023 marks the 55th anniversary of the passage of the Fair Housing Act, which enunciates a national policy of fair housing for all who live in the United States, and

WHEREAS, The Fair Housing Act prohibits discrimination based on race, color, religion, sex, handicap, familial status and national origin, and

WHEREAS, fair housing is a positive community good; and

WHEREAS, economic stability, community health, and human relations in all communities are improved by diversity and integration; and

WHEREAS, Fair Housing is integral to the ethical commitment of members of the National Association of REALTORS® and the Birmingham Association of REALTORS® and is critical to the ability of all real estate professionals to serve their clients, customers and communities; and

WHEREAS, acts of housing discrimination and barriers to equal housing opportunity are repugnant to a common sense of decency and fairness.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rusty Nix, as Mayor of the City of Montevallo, Alabama, do hereby proclaim the month of April, 2023 as "FAIR HOUSING MONTH" in Montevallo to establish Montevallo as an inclusive community committed to fair housing and to promote appropriate activities by private and public entities intended to provide or advocate for equal housing opportunities for all residents and prospective residents of Montevallo.

#### City Council Meeting (3/27/23)

The **new business failure rate** has remained relatively stable over the decades (10% to 20% of new businesses fail in the first year, 50% fail within the first five years, and 70% fail within ten years). The odds of failure are much greater for new businesses that were opened during a recession, especially for new hotels which rely on a thriving economy. Most company presidents, economists, and financial experts believe that we are in for a **deep and lasting recession**.

Banks in financial trouble: SVD bank was given a "clean audit" by KPMG (4<sup>th</sup> largest accounting firm in the world with 670 offices in 150 countries around the world) 14 days before it failed. Both KPMG and bank regulators have been accused of ignoring the bank's financial weaknesses. The failure of SVB and Signature Bank are signs of problems in other banks-up to 200 banks are in jeopardy. If fear of more bank failures takes hold, more banks will fall into financial distress. People are presently taking their money out of small banks and depositing it in large banks (CDs, money market instruments, etc.), or investing in bonds, gold, and silver.

**Prices remain stubbornly high, and some prices are still rising.** For 2022, the annual average increase in prices was 7%. in 2023, the average price increase is projected to be about 6%.

**Inflation reduces the value of paychecks-**If you were working in 2022, the value of your paycheck fell by 7% and it will likely drop by another 6% in 2023.

**Stock Market prices declined**- Prices fell by almost 25% over the past year and those with 401Ks or other retirement plans suffered financial losses.

The money saved by individuals during Covid-19 Pandemic is almost gone.

Credit Card balances are rising-People need cash and delinquencies are rising on credit cards.

Employee' layoffs are increasing- Corporations expect a longer and more serious recession.

Loans-Interest rates have been increasing for mortgages (2X the rate from one year ago) equity lines of credit, student loans, car loans, boat loans, etc. The rate of overdue payments has increased.

**Credit Crunch**-Banks have increased the requirements for taking out a loan.

The Great Resignation: Millions of employees, especially those between the ages of 18 and 39, have resigned from their jobs due primarily to low pay.

**For present and future retirees**-Under the current Social Security system, with an insufficient funds problem hitting by 2034, <u>annual benefits will be reduced by 23% in 2035</u>. Some in Congress have proposed doing away with Social Security and making everyone take out a 401K retirement plan.

The value of the U.S. dollar has fallen. Foreign goods have become more expensive.

The FED is in a no-win predicament: The Fed's goal is lower the inflation rate down to a 2% level. After a record-setting 10X interest rate hike, the inflation rate has only come down to 6% from 7%. If they raise interest rates again, the recession will become more severe; on the other hand, if they don't raise interest rates, prices will keep on rising.

In essence, this is not the time to open a new business.

#### MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This Memorandum of Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into this \_\_\_\_ day of March, 2023 by and between City of Montevallo, Alabama (Montevallo) and United Way of Central Alabama, Inc., an Alabama nonprofit corporation (UWCA").

#### **Background:**

Montevallo is the owner of the land located at 500 County Road 10, Montevallo, AL 35115 (Stephens Park). UWCA, along with its affiliate, Hands On Birmingham, Inc., d/b/a United Way Hands On ("Hands On") desires to build several public parks as part of UWCA's centennial celebration. Montevallo and UWCA both desire that UWCA and Hands On build a public park on Stephens Park.

Accordingly, Montevallo and UWCA agree as follows:

**APPENDIX 8** 

#### Agreement:

- 1. <u>Purpose of Agreement</u>. This Agreement sets forth the terms and conditions under which Montevallo agrees to permit UWCA to construct a public park (the "Park") on Stephens Park.
  - 2. Site. The location and design of the Park is described in Attachment A hereto.
- 3. <u>Montevallo Retains Ownership</u>. Montevallo retains ownership of Stephens Park and shall be the owner of any new facilities or improvements or any other real or personal property added to 500 County Road 10, Montevallo, AL 35115 Stephens Park as part of the Park. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be deemed to convey to UWCA any right, title, or interest in the property except as otherwise provided in this Agreement.
- 4. <u>Permission to Construct Park</u>. Montevallo agrees to grant UWCA the right to construct the Park on the property described above. UWCA and its affiliates shall have the right to access and use the property for the construction of the Park.
  - 5. Representations and Warranties. Montevallo certifies and represents that it:
    - (a) Owns Stephens Park free and clear of any encumbrances and has the unrestricted right to make improvements to Stephens Park; and
    - (b) Is not aware of any easement, law, ordinance, or any other reason that would prevent the construction of the Park;
- 6. Obtaining Necessary Permits and Inspections. UWCA shall be responsible for obtaining all necessary permits and inspections for the construction of the Park. UWCA shall comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and building codes.
- 7. <u>Construction and Costs</u>. UWCA shall be responsible for design and construction of the Park. Before beginning construction, UWCA shall present the plans for the Park to Montevallo for opportunity to comment. UWCA shall construct the Park utilizing volunteer labor and contract with contractors and subcontractors, if necessary. UWCA shall be responsible for all

construction costs, including but not limited to, all materials, labor, and equipment necessary to construct the Park.

- 8. Montevallo to Maintain Site and Facilities. Upon completion of the Park, Montevallo shall have a reasonable opportunity to inspect the Park; if the Park is in acceptable condition, Montevallo shall notify UWCA in writing that it accepts the Park as complete. After acceptance of completion by Montevallo, Montevallo shall maintain the site and facilities of the Park in a clean, orderly and safe condition. Montevallo shall be responsible for any necessary repairs to the facilities of the Park.
- 9. Public Access. Montevallo shall permit the Park to be open to the public during reasonable hours. Montevallo shall operate the Park for the general benefit of the public and shall not restrict the use of the Park for the general benefit of the public. UWCA and Montevallo shall each approve an initial set of reasonable rules and regulations (e.g., hours, age limits, prohibited substances) for the use of the Park. Should Montevallo restrict public access or use of the Park in any way that is, in the reasonable opinion of UWCA, contrary to the intent of this Agreement or the purpose of UWCA to invest funds to establish a safe park for the public, then Montevallo shall pay UWCA a sum of \$65,000 as a partial reimbursement of UWCA's costs, due upon demand after a reasonable period to cure any such default.
- 10. General Cooperation. Montevallo and UWCA shall cooperate in constructing the Park and effectuating the intent of this Agreement. Such cooperation may include, for example, Montevallo allowing contractors and inspectors onto its property, both parties signing any application for permit if required by the City, UWCA ensuring any applicable warranty from a manufacturer or contractor shall be transferred to or otherwise benefit Montevallo and entering into further agreements as necessary for the construction of the Park.
- 11. <u>Liability and Indemnification</u>. After completion of the Park, UWCA shall not be liable for any damage to the facility or injuries to persons using the facility. UWCA shall not be liable for any damages arising from any act or omission of Montevallo, its employees, agents, or contractors, and Montevallo shall not make any related claim against UWCA in any proceeding or manner. Montevallo shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless UWCA from and against any and all claims, damages, liabilities, costs, and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) arising from or related to any injury or claim of injury to any person or property arising from or related to the use of the Park and its facilities. During the term of this Agreement, Montevallo agrees to maintain general liability insurance with limits of at least \$2,000,000 for bodily and personal injury, death, and property damage in a combined single limit, naming both UWCA and Hands On as additional insureds under the policy.
- 12. <u>Disputes</u>. In the event that a dispute should arise between the parties related to this Agreement, the parties agree to first proceed in good faith to submit the matter to mediation. Costs related to mediation shall be mutually shared between the parties.
- 13. <u>Term</u>. This Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and shall continue for a period of 20 years, unless terminated earlier by mutual agreement of the parties.



### DESCRIPTION OF THE PARK

The Park shall be located on the property owned by The City of Montevallo located at 500 County Road 10, Montevallo, AL 35115. The exact boundaries of the Park are described as follows:

#### **Executive Summary**

The City of Montevallo has multiple facilities which require (and will require) a method of providing secure access control to the building as well as to several areas within the building containing critical equipment. The facilities currently requiring secure access are Fire Station #1 and Fire Station #2. In addition to these facilities, the City of Montevallo will also need secure access to the building across the street from City Hall as it becomes available over the next few months (which will also require secure network and WiFi access to the internet within the building). If possible, the City of Montevallo would prefer to be able to manage secure access across all of its facilities from a common interface including the existing City Hall facility which already has an existing on-prem, non-cloud based, Secure Access Control system.

The Fire Station #1 requires secure access to at least 3 doors: Front Door, Back/Side Door and the EMT Equipment room.

The Fire Station #2 was stated to require secure access to the Front Door only. There may be a future desire to securing a back or side door or equipment closet.

While it is unknown what the final requirements for the building across from City Hall, the offerings below will estimate the cost for Fire Station #1 and then how much each additional facility/building will cost to be secured.

#### Solution

While researching different Secure Access Control Systems and related architectures it became apparent that solutions were one of 4 types:

- Traditional Access Control Systems with on-prem centrally located server & SW and door controllers with only the readers & door electronics remotely wired at or near each door.
  - 1. PROS Consistency with solution used at City Hall
  - CONS Significantly less economical for smaller 1-3 door facilities, still requires a separate log-in to each site's on-prem Access Control Server vs a single cloudbased control system
  - 3. CONCLUSION Bid not included as significantly more costs with less benefits
- 2. Access Control Systems with cloud-based SW (vs an on-prem server) connected to traditional on-prem controllers, readers & door electronics.
  - PROS Consistent cloud-based control across all facilities
  - 2. CONS Significantly higher costs with monthly license fees charged per door
  - 3. CONCLUSION Bid not included as VERY expensive (magnitudes higher)

- 3. Access Control Systems with cloud-based SW connected directly to WiFi enabled Locks powered by batteries.
  - 1. PROS Significantly less initial installation costs due to less wiring, can be used in places sometime hard to run new wires, affordable for single door applications
  - 2. CONS Cost for each WiFi enabled Lock is significant (vs an electric door strike), not all door types are easily supported (ie. Push/Panic bar exits), WiFi does not always reach outside doors consistently, batteries in each door need replacing every 3-6 months depending on usage.
  - 3. CONCLUSION Bid not included as this solution is more tailored for single door applications like use in the home but does not lend itself to a consistent multi-door, multi-facility solution and is very maintenance intensive
- 4. Access Control Systems with cloud-based SW connected to controllers and readers integrated and distributed around the network (powered using PoE+).
  - 1. PROS Scalable solution that also fits smaller 1-3 door facilities, includes a firewall for each facility, supports integrated and stand-alone cameras with the same system and software, supports integrated door bell & intercom options, lowest cost approach that scales from 1-3 door to higher count multi-facility control
  - 2. CONS Different SW control than that used in City Hall
  - 3. CONCLUSION Bid included below as the PROS for this approach far outweigh both the CONS as well as the PROS of the other approaches

#### **CONCLUSION:**

CMIT Solutions proposes a solution based on the 4th type of architecture above for both Fire Stations. To make it easy to see what the cost would be to include additional sites (like the building across from the City Hall), the pricing is broken into what it will take to support Fire Station #1 (the initial system) and then what it will take to add each new site based on each additional site starting with 1 additional door to be secured.

**NOTE:** Additional doors at each site are easy to add and cost MUCH less to add than the 1st door at a new site.

#### **HIGH LEVEL SUMMARY (detailed break-down below):**

Fire Station #1 = ~ \$8250 + \$75/mth monitoring, maintenance & support

Each Additional Site = ~< \$4275 + \$25/mth monitoring, maintenance & support
