After School Care:

- We have two new Junior Staff from MHS, with multiple others expressing interest!
- Our Torch Club has officially been regularly leading programs for younger members!


Career Launch – Counselors discussed their career goals with members and asked each to tell what they wanted to do when they get older, and what sort of plan they had so far to achieve that.

- Delta Sigma Theta came out and spent a Saturday morning cleaning the club and the club vans. They swept, scrubbed, mopped, an vacuumed!







Steve -

Let me start off by saying we're very grateful for another Montevallo project and look forward to getting this one moving. EDG is already on standby so we can get moving on survey as quickly as possible. Per our discussion below, I have detailed the high points the Council would likely be interested in. Unless I get delayed downtown or in traffic, I hope to make the Council meeting. Work Session is probably not realistic. In either event, I hope this is helpful -

PROJECT: Intersection Improvements at SR119 & CR22, including left turn lanes on all legs. The proposed improvements will include the aforementioned left turn lanes, signal upgrades to accommodate the left turn lanes, access management improvements at the existing service stations and mast-arm poles (if the City wishes) to match the downtown area signals.

ENGINEERING SCOPE: Turnkey scope including Field Survey, Property / ROW Mapping, Geotechnical Exploration and Materials Report, Environmental Document Coordination and Final Construction Plans. Our engineering contract proposes to use two (2) subconsultants, EDG from Pelham for survey (they have worked for Montevallo before, including the site design for the new City Hall) and Building and Earth Sciences for geotechnical, materials report and signal pole foundation recommendations. Garver will conduct the environmental coordination and prepare traffic signal design and final construction plans, as well as all related ALDOT tasks and coordination.

ENGINEERING FEE: Hourly not to exceed \$139, 514.00 inclusive of all scope outlined above. An estimate of hourly labor is included in Appendix B of the agreement.

CITY OF MONTEVALLO RESPONSIBILITIES:

- PE Fee
- Right Of Way (this will be coordinated with ALDOT depending upon location and Garver will do everything practical to minimize property acquisitions),
- **Utility Relocations if needed**
- SR119/CR22 Traffic Signal Maintenance (FYI you maintain it now as well, we will just update the ALDOT agreement to include the new signal upgrades)

MILESTONES:

I have laid out a preliminary schedule for a target letting date of next summer. The formal ALDOT submittal dates are all very much tied to their published monthly letting schedule (available here) so as that date moves in or out the preceding submittal dates would move accordingly. A very, very important thing to note for this project is the critical path to completion will be dictated by the right-of-way acquisition schedule. What I have outlined below is a realistic design scenario - and you will see I have built in ample time for ALDOT coordination/reviews - but the projected letting date below would be superseded by ROW activities/delays and ALDOT procedural scheduling.

1. Official award date is January 10, 2023. Given ATRP's two (2) year funding window, this project must be bid to a contractor by January 10, 2025. Note this just means BID. The low bidder doesn't even have to have started construction by the funding date as long as we have bid the project.

- 2. Looking at ALDOT's predicted letting schedule, the milestones break down as such assuming an NTP in the near future pending tonight's proceedings:
 - a. Survey appx. one month duration, commencing ASAP after Notice to Proceed
 - b. 30% plan development complete JULY 28, 2023
 - c. Assume August 2023 for ALDOT 30% Plans review, comment and response
 - d. Final environmental coordination and document preparation September 2023. Once we have addressed all of ALDOT's 30% comments, the final document will be in ALDOT's hands to complete so I hesitate to put a hard date on the approval. However, since this is just state money it should go relatively quick.
 - Geotechnical Evaluation, Traffic Signal Design and PSE Plans Development: SEPTEMBER 2023 –
 JANUARY 2023
 - f. Combined PIH-PSE Submittal Date: FEBRUARY 2, 2024
 - g. ALDOT Plan Reviews, Comments and Revisions FEBRUARY-MARCH 2024
 - h. Construction Bureau Submittal APRIL 26, 2024
 - i. Office Engineer Submittal MAY 24, 2024
 - j. Final Construction Plans Complete/Authorization for Construction Date: JUNE 28, 2024
 - k. Projected Project Letting JULY 26, 2024

I will continue to refine this schedule and keep everyone updated as the design progresses and some of these dates become more predictable.

Hope this helps a little in covering the big picture view for the project. If something pops out at you drop me a line and I'll try to get it answered this afternoon just in case. Hopefully I will see you all later tonight.
